Estimated that a rollback would provide near-term savings in excess of \$120 billion to U.S. gasoline and diesel consumers and \$160 billion to U.S. crude oil consumers.
- Constructed a foreign currency option pricing analysis for use in ongoing Department of Justice and Internal Revenue Service tax shelter investigations. Supervised the work of analysts and collaborated with support staff on both the project and client teams. Worked with the project team to prepare client presentations, compose written declarations and prepare the expert for deposition. Analyses were used to advance the prosecution's claim that the derivative transactions lacked economic substance and non-tax business purpose.
- Calculated damages resulting from self-dealing transactions in the insurance industry. Worked closely with the testifying expert to compose written submissions. Collaborated with the project team to develop a strategy for the analysis and support the expert in preparing for deposition and trial testimony. Analysis helped the plaintiff reach a \$115 million settlement, the largest ever for a derivative lawsuit in the Delaware Court of Chancery.
- Performed industry research and designed a model to analyze forecasted operating income of an offshore oil rig. Results were used by the client in determining the fair value charter rate for the rig.
